The Evangelic Alliance (EA Uk): Two bills are coming up in Westminster. We need God's wisdom. Thank you for upholding the EA in prayer.

1. Terminally Ill Adults (End of Life) Bill:

2. Terrorism (Protection of Premises) Bill

This bill ([also known as Martyn's law](#)) has been a long-term pledge by both the former Conservative and the new Labour government. Its aim is to place a legal responsibility on all event spaces and public venues to protect the public from a terrorist incident. The EA has written to the Home Office policy team and is awaiting a response on exception clauses to places of worship, Christian conferences and residential premises. In the coming weeks the EA will be producing a written briefing for MPs and government ministers ahead of committee stage, encouraging them to consider the many social action projects led by churches in their communities. The EA are also calling for a consideration of different types of Christian events to ensure the costs to comply are reasonable and that proposals do not limit or restrict activities or events on the grounds of religious belief.
